2024 GENERAL ELECTION – ANALYSIS OF RESULTS IN WOLVERHAMPTON

Introduction

This analysis looks at the results in the General Elections in the three Wolverhampton constituencies in 2024 and preceding years to try and discern any trends and learn any lessons for future elections (General and Local).

Results

Tables 1,2 & 3 give the results for Wolverhampton North East, Wolverhampton South East and Wolverhampton West respectively.

- The results for numbers of votes cast for each candidate come directly from the Wolverhampton Council website¹. This goes back as far as the 2015 General Election.
- The percentage vote has been recalculated in order to give a figure to the first decimal place (the website rounds to whole number).
- The boundaries of the constituencies changed in 2023 as a result of a review by the Boundary Commission; so the results of 2024 are not completely comparable to those of preceding elections, but I can see no way of easily compensating for that.

The results for the Green Party are summarised in Table 4 below.


- The results prior to 2015 are taken from wikipedia^{2,3,4}
- As far as I can see, no Green Party candidates stood in Wolverhampton prior to 2001 (WGP has only existed as a separate party since 2014, before that being Wolverhampton & Walsall Green Party.



Observations

- In the 2024 G.E. in Wolverhampton Green candidates polled better than the Lib Dems (This was also true in the 2024 Local Elections⁶).
- The trend of Green votes in Wolverhampton has followed the national trend, even down to the spike in 2015, a fall in 2017 followed by a subsequent strong recovery. However, the number of votes from the low of 2017 only increased by a factor of 2 to 2.5 times by 2024; nationally over the same period the Green vote increased 3.5 fold.
- In the May Local Election Wolverhampton Green Party stood candidates in all of the wards that are wholly or partly in the Wolverhampton West constituency and received a total of 2792 votes; in this General Election the Green Party received 2550 votes in the constituency. The difference may well be explained by the fact that two of the wards are partly within another constituency. It does support my surmise that Green supporters are in general going to be more enthusiastic voters (ie most of those who are going to vote Green in a G.E. will have turned out at the L.E. as well). It is not possible to do a similar comparison for the other two constituencies as WGP only stood in a couple of the local wards in them.
